Sr. No.	Questions related to Course Outcomes	
1	Write the basic structure of an HTML document. Ensure your document includes <code><!DOCTYPE html></code> , <code><html></code> , <code><head></code> , and <code><body></code> tags. Include a title for the document in the <code><head></code> section.	
2	Create an HTML page with a main heading (<code><h1></code>), a subheading (<code><h2></code>), and a paragraph (<code><p></code>). Include some sample text in each.	
3	In a paragraph, demonstrate how to use the following HTML formatting tags: <code><sub></code> , <code><sup></code> , <code><mark></code> , and <code><q></code> . Provide example text for each tag.	
4	Add an image to an HTML page using the <code></code> tag. Ensure you include the <code>src</code> and <code>alt</code> attributes. Wrap the image with a <code><figure></code> tag and add a caption using <code><figcaption></code> .	
5	Create two hyperlinks in your HTML document. One should link to an external website (e.g., <code>https://www.example.com</code>), and the other should link to another section within the same page using an anchor tag (<code></code>).	
6	Construct an HTML table with a header row, two data rows, and a caption. Use the <code><table></code> , <code><tr></code> , <code><th></code> , <code><td></code> , and <code><caption></code> tags. Optionally, use <code><colgroup></code> and <code><col></code> to style the columns.	
7	Create three different types of lists in an HTML document: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An ordered list (<code></code>) with at least three items. • An unordered list (<code></code>) with at least three items. • A definition list (<code><dl></code>) with a few terms and their definitions. 	
8	Design a basic HTML form with the following elements: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A text input field (<code><input type="text"></code>). • A submit button (<code><input type="submit"></code>). Include a label for each form element. 	
9	Create a CSS file named <code>styles.css</code> . Link this CSS file to your HTML document using the <code><link></code> tag. Apply the following styles: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Change the background color of the body. • Set a different font family for headings and paragraphs. • Add a border and padding to the table created in Question 6. 	
10	Style the form created in Question 8 using CSS. Apply the following styles: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Change the background color of the input fields and the submit button. • Add some margin and padding to the form elements. • Set a border for the form and adjust its width.
